



The Benefits Wayfinder

Benefitswayfinder.org

An online tool that helps Canadians living on low and modest incomes find and track benefits they could get.

- Simple, intuitive navigation, virtual guide, plain language
- Information on benefits people may be eligible to receive
- Federal, provincial and territorial government information and benefits
- One stop resource with four ways to search for benefits
- Can be used by clients individually and by practitioners to support clients with benefits navigation

Aisha, Ontario

- Married
- Mother of two young children (one with a disability)
- Permanent resident of Canada
- Employed part-time, looking for full-time work
- Household income is under \$25,000 per year
- Is not up to date filing her income taxes
- Worried about paying her rent and bills, may need childcare if full-time work is found



The Disability Benefits Compass https://disability.benefitswayfinder.org

An online tool that provides information about the **four key disability benefits** in your province or territory.

- Plain language and designed by people living with a disability and support staff.
- Within each step are tips, examples, frequently asked questions (FAQ), resources, challenges you may encounter and who to contact for help
- Find out what to expect after you apply and the next steps to take if your application is approved or denied

The project is funded in part by the Government of Canada's Social Development Partnerships Program – Disability Component.





How to use the Benefits Wayfinder

- **Use yourself** find information, training.
- Use with community members:
 - Taxes not filed benefits available.
 - Taxes filed benefits checkup.
- Encourage money conversations:
 - Tax clinic refer to dedicated benefits navigator.
 - 1-to-1 follow-up appointment separate from tax clinic.
- 1-to-1 benefits meeting tips.



NEW! Bridge to Benefits: Implementing benefits access in social services

The <u>Bridge to Benefits tool</u> provides information for **organizations** considering starting, refining or expanding their work in access to benefits services.

Contains information and resources on how to provide services for:

- 1. Learning about benefits
- 2. Applying for benefits
- 3. Getting benefits
- 4. Maintaining benefits

Q - How is Prosper Canada's Benefits Finder similar to Gov't of Canada Benefits Finder? <u>https://srv138.services.gc.ca/daf/q?id=4c890850-ee41-458b-ad80-</u> <u>4c5ff31c5d11&goctemplateculture=en-ca</u>

A - The Benefits Wayfinder includes 'intermediate' plain language summaries. While the Federal finder takes you straight from a 2-sentence intro to the main benefit page, the Benefits Wayfinder has an intermediate summary that gives the highlights of the benefit in plain language, including eligibility criteria and how to apply.

The Benefits Wayfinder enables you to find benefits without answering any questions (unlike the federal site), by using the "Starting Points" feature (this feature allows you to search for benefits by category or life transition such as disability, caring for a child, emergency money need, newcomer and many more). Note that around 70% of Benefits Wayfinder users do not use the questionnaire to find benefits, suggesting that this option is critical for many people.

The Benefits Wayfinder is focused solely on benefits that will put money in your pocket or reduce your expenses. It does not have local and municipal benefits, but this is being looked into by our team.

The Benefits Wayfinder is designed to enable 1-on-1 support with a community member and support person, allowing for customization of community members' benefits list and save/email the list for revisiting in the future.
